

Camp Coordinator - Job Description

The mission of the Kingston Rowing Club is to promote and develop rowing at all levels in the Kingston community. This is accomplished by focusing on excellence in recreation, competition, and coaching, all while fostering community involvement. The Kingston Rowing Club offers a variety of programming to its members, ranging from high performance training and competing, to providing newcomers with an introduction to the sport. We strive to provide a safe environment for all our members that promotes the sport of rowing in Kingston.

The Kingston Rowing Club's Youth Development Program is aimed at introducing the sport of rowing to children between the ages of 8 and 14. The program introduces youth to the fundamentals of the sport as per Rowing Canada's Long Term Athlete Development (LTAD) Pathway, which promotes both skill and physiological development. The key objectives for children in this age group are to learn general sport skills by participating in a wide variety of sports and physical activities. Rowers will be introduced to rowing, among a variety of other sports, and will learn basic boat handling skills and water sense to develop confidence as they become familiar with how boats move. The primary goal of this program is to teach youths the building blocks for more advanced rowing skills as they grow older.

Nature and Scope

KRC is seeking two seasonal Youth Camp Coordinators to work over the 2022 season. Reporting to the VP Programs and the KRC Performance Coach, the Youth Camp Coordinators play an integral role in the mission of the Kingston Rowing Club. You will promote and develop rowing at the youth level, focusing on excellence in recreation, coaching, and fostering community involvement in the sport by supporting new rowers while providing a safe, accessible, and fun experience.

The Kingston Rowing Club is working on expanding its ability to offer programming which will cater to persons with disabilities. The organization has recently invested in equipment which allows participants with a physical disability to partake in the sport, eliminating one of the main barriers to participation.

Responsibilities

- Promoting the program in the Kingston Community.
- Overseeing enrollment, administration, and equipment for programming sessions.
- Creating an inclusive and fun learning environment.
- Teaching rowing fundamentals to participants while providing a safe learning environment.
- Coordinating other sporting activities during the day that align with the program's goals.
- Working within a team to ensure proper athlete supervision and oversight.

This job supports Kingston Youth by providing a fun learning environment that will promote a healthy lifestyle by introducing the basic ideas of nutrition and hydration, as well as by encouraging participation in sports while focusing on having fun.

The above duties are representative of the position but are not meant to be all-inclusive. Employees will be expected to be present at the Kingston Rowing Club when the programming they are responsible for is occurring, however, they may be able to complete part of their hours remotely, subject to approval from their supervisor.

Skills/Attributes

- Be able to work as part of a team through collaboration, respect, and effective communication.
- Be well organized and effectively manage time and priorities, manage a full workload, and meet deadlines in a busy environment.
- Have a commitment to service excellence the candidate will deliberately identify and create opportunities to enhance every individual's experience.
- Have a commitment to children and youth the candidate will commit to assisting in the growth and development of children/youth.
- Have a concern for health and safety the candidate acknowledges and understands how to manage and educate others about risk and harm reduction.
- Excellent communication skills, both written and oral.
- Be able to work in a safe manner as per legislation, policies, and guidelines, including wearing the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), as required.

Qualifications

The successful candidate should possess the following:

- Experience working with shells, rigging, etc.
- Familiarity with small motors.
- Ability to do some heavy lifting, climbing, and carrying as required in the performance of a job.
- A valid G Driver's License is an asset but not a requirement.

Position Requirements

- Must be under 30 years of age to meet the funding requirements of the Canada Summer Jobs program.
- The successful candidate must abide by the Kingston Rowing Club's Code of Conduct and Ethics.
- A Vulnerable Sector Screening, a Screening Disclosure Form, two (2) references related to the position.
- Rowing Canada Complaint (can obtain after candidate selection prior to working with participants).
- CPR and first aid certification (can obtain after candidate selection prior to working with participants).
- Pleasure craft certified (can obtain after candidate selection prior to working with participants).
